The scouts have a famous saying: "Be Prepared!" As we approach the end of the Church's year, and prepare for Advent, the gospel today, and next Sunday, call us to be ready and prepared.

In our ordinary everyday lives, we all know how to prepare and get ready. We get ready if we have a doctor's appointment, or prepare for school or work. If we are going out to somewhere special, we spend extra time getting ready and being prepared. The gospel this Sunday reminds us to be ready and prepared at a much deeper level. We are not simply waiting for the bus to come or the kettle to boil; we are asked to prepare for Jesus. What does this mean for us, to be watching and waiting for Jesus?

The question that is implied in the parable of the wise and foolish wedding guests, is what are we actually doing while we are waiting for Jesus? Are we sitting around with no thought or concern for ourselves and others, or are we actively living our daily lives with meaning and purpose?

How I live my daily life really matters; it is not just about getting up every morning, and doing my best to get through the day. What small, but important things, am I doing each day that brings joy and hope to others, and not just to myself? The challenge and invitation of waiting and being prepared, is that I am trying, my very best to live my daily life, as a follower of Jesus. This will be seen in how I speak, how I act and in how I treat others. Being a Christian and waiting for Jesus, is about how I live my daily life, right here and right now. Let us get ready and be prepared with all our heart, strength and mind!

### REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Today is Remembrance Sunday, when we remember, those who died in the two world wars, as well as the victims of other more recent conflicts. Today there will be the annual



remembrance at the War Memorial, on Church Green, starting a 10.45am, and including the two minutes silence, and the last post.

### WHY RUSH?

Each Sunday, the celebrant at Mass, processes to the porch, to greet those who have attended Mass. It can be disappointing, when a few people make a dash for the door, and don't wait for the celebrant to get there first! Please wait in your places until the celebrant has processed out. Similarly, when there is a recessional hymn this is the final prayer of the Mass, we leave the church when the final prayer, the hymn, is concluded.

### THE SICK & RETIRED PRIESTS

Thank you for your contributions last Sunday, for

the Sick and Retired Priests of our Diocese, to date £1,830 has been donated. This is such an important fund, supporting our 82 sick and retired priests, a number

### JUBILIEE YEAR

Pope Francis has declared that the year 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, about which there will be more information, as we approach this time. Amongst other activities, in preparation, are an invitation to reflect, again, on the main documents of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vatican Council. There will be two online talks, 'the Year of the Council', the first on 7th November, on 'Lumen Gentium': How the Church Looks at Herself, and the second on 28th November 'Gaudium et Spes': How the Church Looks at the World.
