Today, we hear of Jesus encountering ten lepers who cry out to him for mercy. Lepers were the outcasts of society — isolated, shunned, and without hope. Yet Jesus does not turn away. He hears their cry and sends them to the priests, and as they go, they are healed. It's a powerful moment of compassion, but also of faith — they trust Jesus' words, even before they see the outcome.

Of the ten who are healed, only one — a Samaritan, a foreigner — returns to give thanks. Jesus' question still echoes through the centuries: "Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they?" Gratitude, it seems, is not always our first instinct, even when God blesses us.

This passage invites us to reflect on the difference between receiving a gift and truly recognising it. All ten received healing, but only one allowed that healing to deepen into a relationship with Jesus. His gratitude became an act of faith. "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you," Jesus tells him — reminding us that salvation is more than physical well-being; it's about a heart turned toward God.

We, too, have been blessed in countless ways — health, family, faith, the beauty of creation, the gift of the Eucharist. Yet how often do we pause to give thanks? Gratitude transforms our perspective; it helps us see God's hand in the ordinary and opens us to deeper joy.


This week, let us be like the one who turned back — the one who recognised grace, gave thanks, and found not only healing, but salvation. It can be all too easy to say what we haven't got. From time to time though, it's good to recognise what we have received, what God in His goodness has given us. There is a time for us to count our blessings!

ROSARY FOR PEACE

October is the month of the Holy Rosary, last Tuesday being the feast of the Holy Rosary. Praying the Rosary, which takes us through the great moments of Our Lord's Life, is a long-established, traditional, practise. Pope Leo XIV has asked that Catholics across the globe unite to pray the Rosary for peace in war-torn lands, especially Gaza and Ukraine.

He said '...... "I invite everyone, each day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace—personally, in the family, and in community." As we contemplate the wars, taking place in our world, we can feel quite helpless. What we can do, however, is to pray for peace, and during this month of the Rosary, we can heed our Holy Father, and offer it as a prayer for peace.

OLOL AND ST ALBANS DISTRICT FIXERS

The LiveSimply team would like to thank 18 volunteers drawn from both OLOL and St Albans District Fixers, as well as the ladies who provided refreshments, for helping to make our first Repair Fair in Lourdes Hall last Saturday such a wild success! Fifty attendees brought all manner of items from hedge trimmers to audio equipment, and from toasters to a bingo machine, as well as various clothing and textile items. Of these, 23 were fixed and a further 12 were declared fixable but not there and then. For just 6 items, the owner was assured that they could take them to the tip with a clear conscience. A software tool has estimated that we might have averted 52kg of waste and 342kg of CO2 emissions. Not bad for 3 hours work!
