

When we hear about wisdom in today's First Reading, it's spoken of in terms of the Lord Himself, not human beings. We heard "For vast is the wisdom of the Lord; he is almighty and all-seeing". The First Reading speaks of ordinary people, like all of us, making simple moral choices. Ecclesiasticus says: "If you wish, you can keep the commandments, to behave faithfully is within your power". He then shows how black and white such choices are, declaring that God "has set fire and water before you; put out your hand to whichever you prefer. Man has life and death before him.

But Saint Paul in the Second Reading reveals that God grants the Christian disciple a share in the Wisdom of God. Yet this is for a specific reason, the origin of which lies in God's providential will. And he explains that God chooses to bestow His Wisdom upon His children through the preaching of His apostles. In this light, St Paul explains to the Corinthians: "We have a wisdom to offer those who have reached maturity: not a philosophy of our age".

When you and I make choices that are wise choices we follow after Jesus. Living your life by sacrificing your life for others, as Jesus did, opens your life to the Father's Presence. By contrast, following the "*wisdom of this age*" leads nowhere. Your choice is whether to embrace death in this world in the form of self-sacrifice, or to allow death to embrace you for eternity.

The divine Wisdom of Jesus Christ shows us the path that leads to Our Father. But we also need the strength to walk that path. That strength comes through God's grace. The greatest source of grace that Jesus gifted was the Gift of Himself at the Last Supper, which becomes present before us in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

On the 30th January 2023, the application process for Nursery places opended for children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020. Our Early Years provision enables parents to

access 30 hours free childcare with Nursery morning sessions running Monday- Friday, 8.45am - 11.45am and an optional Lunch Club run by school and an afternoon Pre-School run by *Friends Together* running from after lunch club until 3.30pm. Wrap around care offered by *Friends Together* also means that care for children is available between 7.50am and 6pm, should this be required. For further information please visit our website

CAFOD

As we approach Lenten Fast Day on 3rd March, we would like to thank you all for you continued support which enables us to have a truly global impact. CAFOD are committed to being honest, open, transparent and accountable about how we use the money you donate.

For every £1 that you donate, CAFOD will spend 79p on international development,

emergencies, education, campaigning, and

advocacy work. 11p will be spent to generate future income, and 10p will be spent on support costs required to run the organisation. Of the 79p spent on international development, emergencies, campaigning, and education work, the breakdown is the following:

- 42p is spent to fund our international programmes work;
- 30p is spent on emergencies and disaster relief;

• 7p is spent on advocacy and UK education. Our Lenten appeal will focus on CAFOD's work in Bangladesh in the face of climate change.
