

A clear message in today's scripture readings is of the centrality, and necessity, of prayer in our lives. We hear of Moses the great prophet and intercessor, doing what he did best, unceasingly interceding for his people.

As long as Moses' hands were lifted up to God in prayer, the Israelites soldiers were victorious in battle. Our fruitfulness in life depends on God. It also reminds us that the solution to our daily activities and struggles have both a spiritual and physical dimension. In all circumstances of life, we need to abide in God's presence with our minds and hearts lifted up to him in prayer.

Jesus, in the Gospel, further underscores the importance of continuous prayer. We heard: "He told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and not to lose heart" Through, this parable, Jesus teaches us be consistent and persevere in prayer at all times. Of course, as a man of prayer himself, he knew how important prayer was for his disciples. It would be the key to the success of their mission.

The same goes for all of us disciples. If we are to have any real success in our respective vocation and missions, prayer has to be at the foundation of our Christian life. It is an indispensable tool if our life is to be fruitful. Jesus encourages us to persevere in prayer, and, at the same time, to draw strength from God.

Finally, we must never be tired of praying because God is never tired of listening to us. He might take time to open the door like the judge in today's parable. However, if we pray persistently, He will surely hear, and answer us.

Each year, in September and October, every Catholic church in the country, is asked, for four Sundays, to count how many people are present for Mass on those days. While that doesn't tell us how many Catholics there are in England, it does tell us how many people are present at Mass on

Mass count has taken place since the pandemic restrictions were lifted. You may be interested to see the figures for our parish. In 2019, the average attendance, for the four Sundays, was 692, while this year it was 506. That is a drop of 186, 27%. What has happened to these people is not known. The most likely explanation is that maybe during the pandemic, they simply 'lost' the habit of attending Mass. There is still a need, then, to encourage those not attending Mass, to do so. After all, as a parish community we are not just a collection of individuals, who happen to attend Mass, but we do have a responsibility for each other.

It seems a long time ago now, but about two and a half years ago, in March 2020, the parish survey was conducted. The pandemic slowed down, and stopped, many things. However, the work of analysing the survey responses proceeded, as did the more recent formation of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC).
