"Sir, we would like to see Jesus."

We don't know what drew the Greeks to express their desire to see Jesus in the opening scene of today's Gospel. We also don't know, whether they actually got to see him. What we do know is that their desire "to see" becomes the occasion, for Jesus to teach his disciples, and us, about the true way of "seeing" and living. This gospel, prepares us to "see" that way lived out fully in Holy Week. It focus' on what must die and what must live.

Jesus says of himself, that like a grain of wheat, that must fall to the ground and die to bear fruit, so he will surrender everything, even to his own hour of dying, to bring forth life. He speaks of surrender. This is our pattern—our own path that we must go through as his followers. We are all grains of wheat in him, and we all have some dying to do if we are to experience, a flourishing of life—a "letting go." We die to all that is false in the world, all that is sinful and not of God, to find our deeper identity and happiness in God. "Whoever serves me must follow me," Jesus says, "and where I am there also will my servant be."

We know this is not easy, whatever dying we need to do. We resist it. Jesus paid a dear price in his own "letting go." "I am troubled now," he says today. In our reading from Hebrews, we hear this crisis of soul: "...he offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to the One who was able to save him..." Still, Jesus freely held the tension—most deeply on the cross—trusting in the love that saves, that brings fullness of life.



FRIDAY MASS & STATIONS

Each Friday during Lent, there will be Mass at 7.00pm, followed by the Stations of the Cross. This could be a good Lenten Practise. Giving an hour each week, to attend an extra Mass, and to follow Jesus' journey to Calvary, by making the Stations of the Cross.

THE WAY OF THE CROSS

Join us on Sunday 24th March at 7.30pm as we take a guided tour through the reflections of individuals caught up in the events of Good Friday. This will be a tour of the 14 stations of the cross where at each station there will be a monologue by an actor representing a witness to that particular station. It begins at High Street Methodist where the first group of tourists (30) led by a guide start their journey from there across to St. Nicholas church and then to Our Lady of Lourdes. We will be the 14th station.....Jesus is laid in the tomb....and will have the replica of the tomb, an actor playing Joseph of Arimathea, the choir singing and then refreshments in the Undercroft. The first group starts at 7.30 pm and the second group at 8pm.....the journey lasts 45 minutes.

As the tour will take place inside as well as outside, coats will be required. Free tickets must be booked in advance via <u>www.highstreet.church/easter</u>

PROTECTING THE UNBORN

An amendment has been proposed (New Clause 1), to the Government's Criminal Justice Bill, which is coming up for Report stage in Parliament in early March. This amendment seeks to change criminal law so that "no offence is committed by a woman acting in relation to her own pregnancy" at any gestation. This means that a woman who induced her abortion at home using pills (or any other method) at any stage of pregnancy, including just before natural birth, would commit no offence. This is dangerous for women and lethal for unborn babies. Please contact your MP urgently, asking them to oppose this extreme proposal. You can do this using SPUC's easy to use web tool, please pray for the defeat of this amendment, for protection of unborn babies, and help and comfort for mothers in need.
