It's not unusual to hear of Jesus giving time to pray. The sense that the Gospels communicate is that prayer was at the very heart of what Jesus did and said. Who better for us to learn from, when it comes to how we are to pray? Today, and next Sunday, we will hear Jesus teaching us about prayer. Today we will hear a parable which is a lesson in persistence in prayer; while next Sunday's parable will address attitude in prayer.

The parable, it may seem, presents prayer as 'nagging' God for what we want, but, of course, such thinking misses the point. God is *not* like the judge in the parable, worn down by requests and coerced to respond. The key is found in the description of the judge as corrupt and unjust. Since God is neither corrupt or unjust, we must understand Jesus to be saying that if even an unjust judge responds to the persistence of the widow, how much more so will God listen to our prayers.

Because God is a truly loving God, He doesn't need to be nagged. God already knows our needs, and is more than ready to respond to us. That said, God truly wants to hear our needs and to respond generously. At the same time, He wants us to depend on Him completely, that is why we persist in prayer. It is the final lament of Jesus that gets to the point of the parable. The lesson is about the persistence of the one who prays. God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, "Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?" In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart.

PRAY THE ROSARY

October is the month of the Holy Rosary, and last week we celebrated the feast of the Holy Rosary last week. Praying the Rosary, is a very good practice, as it takes us through, reminds us of, the great moments of Our Lord's Life, a long-established, traditional, practice. It is very much Our Lady pointing out her son to us, drawing us closer to him. Pope Leo XIV has asked that Catholics across the globe will unite to pray the Rosary for peace in wartorn lands, especially

He said '...... "I invite everyone, each day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace—personally, in the family, and in community." As we contemplate the wars, taking place in our world, we can feel quite helpless. What we can do, however, is to pray for peace, and during this month of the Rosary, we can heed our Holy Father, and offer it as a prayer for peace.
