The prophet Zephaniah, in the first reading, speaks to a people unsettled and uncertain, yet his words are surprisingly tender. He does not call first for strength, achievement, or clever solutions. Instead, he turns our attention to *the humble of the land* — those who know their need of God, those who do not rely on themselves alone. Humility, in Zephaniah, is not weakness. It is truthfulness before God. The humble are those who seek the Lord, who desire what is right, and who are content to place their lives into God's hands. They are not loud or self-promoting; they are steady, faithful, and quietly attentive to God's ways.

In the closing verses, Zephaniah offers a beautiful promise: "*I will leave among you, a people humble and lowly.*" This remnant does not deceive or harm; they live without fear, resting in God's care. It is a vision of a community shaped not by power, but by trust. This humility can become a model for our prayer. True prayer does not begin with fine words or perfect thoughts. It begins by standing honestly before God, acknowledging our limits, our dependence, and our hope. To pray humbly is to say, often without words: "*Lord, I need you. Guide me. Stay with me.*"

In a world that prizes confidence and self-assertion, these readings gently remind us that God draws close to those who make space for him. When we pray with humility, we allow God to act — not on our terms, but on his. Perhaps this week we might ask ourselves: do I leave room for God in my prayer, or do I try to manage everything myself? Like the humble of the land, may we learn to seek the Lord quietly, trust him deeply, and rest in the peace he alone can give.

PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Tomorrow, Monday, we celebrate the last of the Christmas Feasts, The Presentation of the Lord. On this day we recall Mary and Joseph presenting the Child Jesus, in the Temple, where he is received by two people of Faith, Simeon and Anna, who had lived their lives in the hope of meeting the Messiah. Mass tomorrow is at 9.15am.

ST BLAISE

Next Tuesday, as well as being the feast of SS Laurence, Dunston & Theodore, its is also the feast of St Blaise. On this date it is traditional to receive the blessing of St Blaise for the healing of throats. The blessing will take place at the 9.15am Mass.

NEW ARCHBISHOP OF WESTMINSTER

On the 19th December 2025, it was announced that Pope Leo has appointed Bishop Richard Moth to be the next Archbishop of Westminster, replacing Cardinal Vincent Nichols. He will be formally installed and enthroned as the twelfth Archbishop of Westminster on the 14th February. Please pray for Archbishop-Elect Moth and Cardinal Nichols during the time of transition.

PROTECTING LIFE

The House of Lords will debate the amendment related to abortion up-to-birth, on the last day of the Committee Stage either on 27th January 2026 or 2nd February 2026. This is a very worrying development. Please write to members of the House of Lords and ask them to fight the extreme abortion up-to-birth amendment. This was not in any party's manifesto.
