A theme common to all three readings, is that of changing one's mind. Our capacity to change our minds leaves us open, to hazard and to hope; hazard when we choose, as Isaiah says, "to renounce our integrity and to commit sin, hope when we choose to renounce sin to become law-abiding and honest".

The Gospel story shows us the nobility of a humble change of mind. The first son "thought the better of it." He was open to change, to better thoughts. The second son was set and closed. The ability to change one's mind, is essential to all healthy relationships. A mind that is closed, whether from pride, stubbornness or stupidity, tends to destroy all relationships—such as, when we refuse to admit a mistake, when we are unwilling to apologise and change our ways, when we persist in prejudice against a person or group, when we think we know it all.

The second reading, from Philippians, talks of a more specific and positive change of mind: "in your minds, you must be the same as Christ Jesus'. This is the direction, in which we must be constantly changing our minds day by day. Paul emphasises one aspect, in particular of the mind of Christ, his humble openness and self-emptying.

Jesus did not cling. He knew that reality could be trusted, because at the heart of reality is "Abba Father," and that underneath everything, even death, are the everlasting arms. So, he did not cling even to life, "accepting death, death on a cross." "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." May this mind be in us, as it was in Christ Jesus.

prayerfully reflect on these important moments


#### FROM THE PARISH OFFICE

### AREN'T WE FORTUNATE!

In our part of Hertfordshire, we have such an outstanding and historical building as St. Albans Abbey / Cathedral. It was founded in the 8<sup>th</sup> Century and is the Shrine of Britain's first `Saint and Martyr, and is the oldest site of continuous Christian worship in this country. The other very unusual aspect of the life of this

Church of England Cathedral is that Catholic Mass is celebrated there every week. There is no other example of this anywhere in the UK. It has taken place since 1983 every Friday. On Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October at 12.00noon there will be a celebration Mass which will mark the fortieth anniversary of the Catholic Mass at the Cathedral. Do think about taking the opportunity to be present on this significant occasion. On Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> October the Cathedral itself will celebrate a Solemn Evensong celebrating its work

of relating with other churches in our part of Hertfordshire.
