The gospel today, may seem that Jesus is 'doing' nothing. He is not healing anyone or working a miracle. He is not in the temple, synagogue or market place teaching or speaking to the crowds. He may not even be with his disciples; it seems that he is on his own. What he is doing is talking to God - Jesus is praying, and he is praying for us! Have you ever thought of that; that Jesus actually prays for us?

Why would he need or want to do this? As the men and women who were his closest friends and followers begin to tell others about Jesus and the Kingdom he prays for them because they need all the help and support they can get! This is part of a prayer which asks God to guide, lead and encourage them so that they may be one. This is a prayer asking for unity, and community, for the friends and disciples of Jesus. If they are to be fruitful and effective in their mission and ministry, they need to stay and work together. They can't be witnesses to Jesus by working on their own.

This prayer is meant for us today too. While we have a personal relationship with God and Jesus, we are also part of our parish, and the wider and bigger Church; we are part of the Body of Christ. Our mission today is much the same as that of the early church. Today we are called to be active in living our daily lives as followers of Jesus and doing all we can to promote and build God's kingdom. We can't do this on our own; we too need God's and each other's help, support and encouragement, just as we need the prayer of Jesus.

St Paul encourages us: 'welcome one another, as Christ has welcomed you'. Our parish is a welcoming parish and, as many of you indicated in the parish survey, your hope is that it will become even more welcoming.
