

Today we hear the unusual parable of the "dishonest steward." At first hearing, it can leave us scratching our heads. Why would Jesus appear to praise someone who acts with trickery and self-interest? Yet the point is not that dishonesty is good, but that the steward acted with urgency, creativity, and determination in a moment of crisis.

Jesus observes that the "children of this world" can sometimes show more energy and resourcefulness than the "children of light." People often devote great effort to securing their financial future, yet how much energy do we put into securing our eternal one? The parable challenges us to examine our priorities. Do we show the same decisiveness and imagination in living our faith as we do in worldly matters?

The second part of the Gospel makes the lesson clearer. Jesus reminds us that "the person who is trustworthy in very small matters is trustworthy also in great ones." Faithfulness does not begin with grand gestures, but with the little things: honesty in daily work, patience in family life, kindness to a neighbour, generosity with our time. These "small matters" reveal where our heart truly lies.

We are also reminded that money and possessions are not ends in themselves but gifts entrusted to us for a greater purpose. They are meant to be used wisely, to build relationships, to serve others, and to strengthen our bond with God. How we use what we have—our money, our talents, our time—shows whether we live for ourselves alone, or for the Kingdom of God. May we ask for the grace to be faithful stewards of all God has given us, so that, in both little things and great, we reflect His generosity and love.
