In Jesus' parable this Sunday, of the vineyard owner, there is a reversal of payment made to the workers at the end of the day. Those who came last and worked very little, are paid first and the exact same amount, as those who had laboured all day. The "sting" in the story is not so much that the last workers are paid first, but something else. It is the landowner's words of self-defence in the face of criticism, that is supposed to grab our attention. What might have shocked the first hearers of the parable and maybe ourselves as well, is the apparent injustice, the seeming unfairness, on the part of the landowner.

The vineyard owner's decision to "do as I please with my money" forms the heart of the parable. In the parable the landowner is to be understood as representing God. With this in mind, we can presume that God does what He wills, whether we "like it or not," so to speak. God's generosity cannot be outdone, and it may be very different from our own standards of conduct.

Today's parable, is a good reminder of God's gracious generosity. No one is excluded and all are welcome to receive it. In the face of divine goodness, human prejudice, narrowness and selfishness are in sharp contrast to the way God acts. Rather, we are challenged to mirror and express in our lives the bountifulness of God. This message is no less important today, than it was when first proclaimed.

We are always free to resist, or reject God's ways and close ourselves to His gifts. However, as we heard in the first reading: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my waysso high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts".
