

Shepherds may not be as familiar to us, as they were at the time of Jesus. The language and images in the gospel may even seem a little strange to us, and may even be outside our experience altogether.

Today, we hear Jesus using the image of the shepherd to describe himself and his relationship with us. When Jesus uses the image and symbol of the shepherd, the people to whom he was speaking would have understood what he was talking about immediately. But what does the image of Jesus the shepherd mean for us today? While sheep all look the same to us, a shepherd knows each of them individually. When a shepherd calls a sheep, the sheep recognises the voice and responds. Just as the shepherd knows the sheep, the sheep knows and trusts the shepherd. The shepherd guides and protects the sheep. The sheep go where the shepherd leads them.

We are not sheep! But the Lord knows and loves each of us as individuals. We are not all the same to Jesus. He loves each of us personally and intimately. If a shepherd cares for his sheep with great love and devotion, how much more does Jesus love and care for each of us?

Jesus does not call and ask us to follow him just for the sake of it. He offers us not only the fullness of life; he offers us the fullness of his life. Jesus came so that each of may have life and have it to the full. This fullness of life is offered to us here and now, not some time in the future.

As we continue our journey through Easter in preparation for the celebration of Pentecost, may each of us realise how deeply and personally Jesus loves us. When Jesus calls us by our name, may we answer in faith, gratitude and gratefulness. May we follow where he leads us.

PRIESTS TRAINING FUND

Today, the 4th Sunday of Easter, is also 'Good Shepherd 'Sunday, when we are asked to especially pray for vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. In our Diocese, the annual collection is also made for the training of those who will serve as priests. In other words, it is one of the few collections which you benefit from Currently, there are 18 students preparing for ordination in our Diocese, at Allen Hall, and at colleges in Rome and Valladolid. The cost of training future priests is expensive, and there are no other funds available. The Diocese relies on the people of the parishes. Fr Javier Ruiz, Vice-Rector at Allen Hall, will be speaking at the Masses this Sunday morning about the work of Priestly formation, and asking for your help. Your contributions will be collected after Mass today, if you wish to 'gift-Aid' your contribution, please use one of the envelopes, that will be found in the porch.

CORONATION

The coronation of King Charles III will take place next Saturday, 6th May,

in Westminster Abbey. The Bishops of England and Wales invite us to pray, from Wednesday 3th May until Friday 5th May, for His Majesty the King as he assumes the fullness of the high office of monarch. We can do this in our daily prayer asking Almighty God to guide the King in his appointed tasks. We can also pray for him when we gather for prayer at Mass. Let us ask God's continuing blessing on our new King and Queen. Prayer cards have been produced by the Catholic Bishop's Conference and are available in the porch.
