Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's mother-in-law, just as he also cured, many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak, because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present.

On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others, who brought news, that many people were looking for him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role, for the inner circle of Jesus' disciples—they act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to his disciples, that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick, is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence, to others in its ministry, to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. No doubt in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. For ourselves too, we can bring our decision-making to God in prayer, drawing him into our decision-making, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.

PARISH FEAST DAY

Next Sunday, 11th February, is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, our parish feast day. To mark this day there will be an additional Mass at 3.00pm, which will include the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This Sacrament is for those



who are of 'advanced age and are chronically unwell'.

FROM THE CARDINAL

Following a request from the Holy Family parish in Gaza City, and from the Latin Patriarch in Jerusalem, the Cardinal asks that a collection is made to assist those, who are suffering so terribly in the Holy Land. The Cardinal writes: 'In the last few days I have heard directly, via Zoom, from the Parish Priest of the Church of the Holy Family in Gaza City and from the CEO of the Latin Patriarchate. The situation they face is grave and most demanding. We were told that there are still 600 people sheltering and being cared for in the parish compound, together with over 50 seriously disabled and vulnerable children. Water and food can be bought in the local markets at much inflated prices. With the damage inflicted on this site some time ago now, cooking hot meals is only possible three times a week. The parish is also providing for 200 people in the Orthodox property as well as for local Muslim neighbours. Today, there will be a collection for this cause, after all the Masses.

GOOD NEIGHBOURS -NEW VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Last May, we launched our Good Neighbours initiative within the parish, with over 50 volunteers coming forward and being organised into teams to cover different areas



of the parish, providing a friendly face and a point of contact for other parishioners in the area. Some examples of the types of things our volunteers have done: Made contact with the households in their area. Welcomed new parishioners in their area.

Delivered Christmas leaflets.

Kept in touch and checked in with older or vulnerable parishioners.

Liaised with the Parish Office to organise assistance such as a Eucharist Minister visit. The role is not onerous but is central to putting our parish mission into practice and demonstrating that Our Lady of Lourdes, through its parishioners, is a warm and caring parish, and we are grateful for everything our volunteers do. We are currently looking for a person or persons to take on covering the Roundwood area, and an additional person to assist the current volunteer covering the Townsend Lane-Moreton End Lane area.
