As schools return, and universities recommence, there is a sense of a new beginning, a new year. In parish life too, it is a time of new beginnings, or at least restarting, a time to look forward with hope, and also to reflect on how we can each play our part in the life we share as a community of faith.

In the second reading St Paul reminds us of the heart of Christian discipleship. Speaking of Jesus, he says: "Though he was in the form of God, he did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped, but emptied himself... and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Therefore, God has highly exalted him.". These words show us that the pattern of Christ's life is one of self-giving service. It is through humility and offering ourselves to others that true glory is revealed.

As we begin this new 'year' in our parish life, we are invited to follow that same pattern. The parish is not simply a place where we "come to church," but a living family where each person's gifts matter. Christ's example teaches us that greatness is found not in being served but in serving. There are many opportunities for involvement: in worship, music, catechesis, visiting the sick, caring for the poor, welcoming newcomers, and in countless unseen acts of kindness. Each contribution, no matter how small it may seem, strengthens the body of Christ here among us.

This might be a moment to ask ourselves: how might I share more actively in parish life? How can I reflect Christ's humility and generosity in the way I serve? If each of us takes a step forward, our parish will grow ever more deeply into the community God calls us to be.

NEW BEGINNINGS

During the year there are a number of new beginnings. This week has seen most of the schools reopening, and over the next few weeks some of our young people will be starting, or returning, to university. In the parish too, sacramental programs will be commencing, and many of our parish activities will be resuming. It's a time to start again, which reflects our life of faith. God, allowing us, again and again, to make a new beginning. God setting new opportunities before us. Hopefully many of you will have the opportunity for a holiday, or some rest, and are feeling energised. Energised to cope with your daily responsibilities, and to participate in the life and activities of our parish.

A SAINT OF OUR TIME

Today, in Rome, Pope Leo will canonise Blessed Carlo Acutis, who was born in London on 3 May 1991, and Baptised in our Diocese, in the Servite Church, Fulham. From a young age he showed a deep love for God and a remarkable devotion to the Eucharist, which he called his "highway to heaven." Despite being an ordinary teenager who loved football, video games, and computers, Carlo lived his faith with extraordinary simplicity and joy.

Gifted with a talent for technology, he used his skills to spread the Gospel. At just eleven years old, he began working on a website cataloguing Eucharistic miracles from around the world, so that others could come to appreciate the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

Carlo's life was marked by kindness, charity, and a strong sense of justice. At the age of fifteen, he was diagnosed with an aggressive form of leukemia. Offering his suffering for the Church and for Pope

Benedict XVI, he died on 12 October 2006. He was beatified in Assisi in 2020. Today we rejoice as he is Canonised, and we can pray to him that his Canonisation, will inspire our young people.

SEASON OF CREATION

The Season of Creation, runs from September 1st until October 4th, the feast of St Francis of Assisi. The Season of Creation, is a time of sustained prayer and action, lasting a month and four days. During this season we are encouraged to pray and engage in activities, that will deepen our relationship with God, our neighbour and the earth we share, being ever more attentive to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.

If you receive a suspicious email, please delete it immediately or contact the parish office for clarification.

TO REPORT A SCAM TEXT, forward it to 7726 (SPAM), a free service that allows your mobile provider to investigate and take action. You should also report scams to Action Fraud by calling 0300 123 2040 or visiting their website, especially if you've lost money to a scam. Finally, if you received a scam link in a text, report the website to the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC).

- 1. Report to your mobile provider:
 - Forward the text: to the number 7726.
 - Your provider will send you a reply and ask for the scam text's number. Reply with the number, and they'll investigate.

What to do with the scam text:

- Do not click: on any links in the message.
- Do not reply: to the text message.
- Delete: the message after you have forwarded it.

A TALK ABOUT A PILGRIMAGE TO NOTRE DAME AND LOURDES


Carole Cox a member of the Newman Association will give a talk on her experiences of pilgrimages to both Notre Dame and Lourdes on
